#### The Vent Bobby Compton

By all accounts, the 2016 annual meeting in Laramie was a success! We had 208 attendees (42 were students), 36 oral presentations (10 were students), and 14 poster presentations (8 were students). We ended up with nearly \$12,000 in meeting income; \$9,000 more than we expected. This was due to increased registration income from the high number of attendees, unexpected raffle income (the fat bike was truly a hit!), and generous sponsors. We awarded \$3,400 in travel grants and \$1,500 in small project grants. Additionally, 127 people attended at least one of the three Continuing Education Courses.

The 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration drew in many Chapter members, both young and old. It was amazing to visit with the new generation of energetic students from our three Student Subunits and share stories with many of the retired members who graciously made the trip to the Gem City. Being able to chat with people like Mary McAfee, Steve Facciani, David Dufek, and Steve Flickinger made me really appreciate our Chapter pride and how much we all have done to make it succeed. The retrospective symposium further highlighted the changes, challenges, and good times our members have experienced over 50 years.

At the Western Division level, the Executive Committee (which includes all Chapter presidents) recently voted to approve a structured rotation of Western Division Annual meetings so that all nine chapters will host an annual meeting every nine years. We last hosted a Western Division meeting in Jackson in 2012, and the proposed schedule lists us

hosting again in 2023, 11 years later. The Western Division is scheduled to host the 2023 Parent Society meeting. Did you catch that? The big meeting may be coming to our town in 2023! We last hosted an AFS meeting in Jackson in 1962 and in Denver in 1960. Both of these meetings occurred before our CO/WY Chapter was established, so in reality our Chapter has never hosted a national meeting. Based on past successful meetings and our active and dedicated membership, there is no doubt we are ready for the challenge of hosting a large meeting. I invite all our members, both rookie and veteran, to step up in planning and hosting this event, if it truly does come our way. It will be a great opportunity to show the fisheries world our Chapter excellence and the fantastic aquatic resources of Colorado and Wyoming.

The "Max" Award of Merit went to two recipients; Jim White (above) for being a stellar aquatic biologist in the San Juan and Dolores River basins completing a Colorado River Cutthroat Trout restoration project on Hermosa Creek while coordinating and monitoring the Gold King mine spill on the Animas River near Silverthorn, and to the Platte River Revival (Below) for the grassroots community-led restoration effort to improve water quality, enhance fisheries and riparian habitat, provide greater recreational opportunities, and improve the economic benefit of the North Platte River to the City of Casper, Wyoming.



# **Mentoring Committee Updates**

2015 CO/WY AFS Mentee, Katie Deroche, has assisted her Mentor, Christina Barrineau (Wyoming Game and Fish Department, Aquatic Habitat Biologist, Laramie) with a few important projects. Beginning in June, Katie assisted with the Platte Valley Habitat Partnership Volunteer fence removal day (see photo). Katie worked hard removing old fence to improve movement corridors for wildlife, and got to meet with folks for the local conservation district and Trout Unlimited. Katie also assisted with a watershed assessment and fish passage assessment in a drainage in the Snowy Range. Katie learned about stream and watershed health, as well as why fish passage at irrigation diversions is important. Steve Gale stepped in to help Katie get some electrofishing experience. Katie was excited to help Steve with sampling in Crow Creek in Cheyenne. The sampling was part of an effort to further understand the non-game fish community in Crow Creek. Katie looks forward to assisting Christina in the fall as her school schedule allows.

2016 CO/WY AFS Mentee, **Cody Tyler**, has been assisting his Mentor, April Kraft (Colorado Parks and Wildlife, Aquatic Animal Health Lab, Brush) with a variety of fish health projects. Cody's first experience at the lab was focused on testing for *Myxobolus cerebralis*, a

myxosporean parasite that causes whirling disease. Cody assisted by defleshing Rainbow Trout heads from the Glenwood Springs State Fish Hatchery. Cody also helped in the PCR lab by extracting DNA from Cutthroat Trout. These fish were tested to ensure that they are pathogen free before being stocked via airplane in high mountain lakes. In addition, Cody traveled to Boulder to assist with a fish health inspection. Tissue samples from 60 Rainbow Trout were collected and sent to the lab for parasitology, bacteriology, and virology testing.

Working with Lori Martin for the second season, 2016 CO/WY AFS veteran Mentee, **Kristina Morben** remarks:



Hello Colorado-Wyoming AFS members! I want to express my deep appreciation for the travel grant you offered me in order to attend and present at the Western Division 2016 Annual Meeting in Reno. I would not have been able to attend without the ability to request the out-ofstate travel on a no-cost basis to my agency. I presented the paper "Genetic contribution of native and introduced catostomids to larval drift in experimental and control streams of the Gunnison River Basin", including the 2015 genetics results that I was not able to include at our prior chapter meeting in Laramie. It was a part of the largest symposium of the meeting -The Ecology and Management of Western Native Fishes – which covered the gamut from high elevation Cutthroat and Golden Trout to Chinook Salmon and Delta Smelt.

There were some very good symposia and papers at the meeting and I enjoyed many papers both within and outside of the symposium in which I presented. Professionally, I made some good contacts with other folks working on native fishes of concern in our Division, including the "Western Native Fishes Committee", the goal of which is to encourage professional interaction among biologists working in the native fish arena all over our Division.

Parent Society members, if you were at our Chapter Meeting business luncheon in Laramie, you may recall that not many applications were received for either the professional or student travel grants. These grants are a great opportunity to get to attend an AFS meeting that


